
WA Field Target round



Waiting line


The purpose of this round is to bring the concept of field archery to a target club, if they won't come to us we need to take Field to them.

As with WA field it is shot in ends of 3 on normal field faces, at the distances of the marked round. Scoring will be as per WA field with 6 for the centre to 1 for the outer zone giving a maximum score of 216 for the 36 arrows on field score sheets.

Each archer will shoot at one peg retrieve and score their arrows, then move to the target to the right until all four faces have been shot. When all have shot 1-4 A everyone moves forward to B and repeat then to C. The targets are laid out in the manner shown to simulate the sight changes for every target as in WA field.

The target distances to the left are for red peg distances and would work as well for Blue peg distances, to avoid confusion I would set up two ranges if equipment and space permit with blue and red pegs alternating.

All safety rules for target apply e.g. Overshoot, control of shooting, range markers.




Each archer will shoot at one peg retrieve and score their arrows, then move to the target to the right until all four faces have been shot. This would best be shot On field bosses but could be shot on target bosses lowered.
