DEFIBRILLATORS

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Course Aim

• To help give confidence in dealing with a situation that may occur during an archery meet or at any time.

Statistics

 Approximately 140,000 people on average die from cardiac arrest in the UK each year, 241 of which are school children

Survival to hospital discharge presently approximately 5-10%

 Bystander CPR is a vital intervention before the arrival of Emergency Help arrives – double or triple survival from SCA (Sudden Cardiac Arrest)

Early Resuscitation and prompt Defibrillation (within 10 minutes) can result
in > 75% survival

Defibrillators - What are they?


- A life saving machine.
- Simple to use.
- By anybody.
- Used in conjunction with CPR.

Where are they?

- Public places.
- Village Halls, Community Centres, Shopping Precincts, Sports Centres
- Do you know where your local one is?

CPR - Cardio pulmonary resuscitation

- CARDIO-PULMONARY RESUSCITATION
- 30 CHEST COMPRESSIONS
- Place the heel of one hand in the centre of the chest
- Place other hand on top and Interlock fingers, with elbows locked
- Compress the chest Rate 100/120 C/P/M Depth 5-6 cm
- Equal Compression : Release
- If possible change CPR operator every 1-2 mins
