Dear Colleagues,

Please find below a few bits of information to keep you up to date with the latest news.

1) Judge Changes and news

Many congratulations to Martin Whiting from Hampshire who passed his County assessment. His new grade will start straight away.

Welcome to a new Candidate, Kate Buxton from Hampshire. I am sure you will all help her feel welcome and consider her for tournaments.

Sadly Ciaran Campbell, a National Judge from Northern Ireland passed away on 15th June. Ciaran had acted a JLO for Northern Ireland and was a National Technical Official at the London 2012 Paralympics. Our thoughts are with his family and friends at this time.

3) World Archery Judge Newsletter

4) World Archery Interpretations

World Archery have released two new Interpretations

Book 2 – 3.12.1.3 – regarding whether Judges can request equipment be disassembled.

Book 4 – 22.3.6.2 – regarding a Barebow with built in weights in Field and 3D

5) New Rules on Shoot Offs in World Archery

Don't forget about the new World Archery rules for Shoots offs.

If compound and they both shoot an X then they shoot another arrow automatically, then the arrow nearest the middle wins. Otherwise it is just the arrow nearest the middle.

If recurve and they both shoot a 10 (and this includes Xs) then they shoot another arrow automatically, then the arrow nearest the middle wins. Otherwise it is just the arrow nearest the middle.

I know Para only events are not that common, but for these were there is a W1 event then there is a second shoot off arrow if they both shoot a 10.

6) Bow Queries from the Judges Working Group

The Judges Working Group have sent out their answers to a couple of queries they have received about bows in Field and 3D.



This bow is not permitted for barebow unless it is taped to remove the change in the width of the riser. It provides an additional aiming point. This was also covered in an Interpretation from World Archery (Rule 22.4.1).



This riser is allowed as the stabiliser mounting is part of the riser and has not been added.

7) Dress Regulations

Please remember that for all normal Record Status and above shoots in the UK the Archery GB Dress Regulations apply, this includes World Record Status tournaments, such as 720s, 1440s and Head to Heads.

This means that there is no rule about the length of shorts and skirts and archers can wear denim – just not blue denim.

Please make sure you are up to date on Rule 307.

If someone arrives wearing incorrect clothing then ask them to change. It may be possible they can borrow a jacket or waterproof trousers to cover up, or turn a t-shirt inside out. If a solution cannot be found then you can, with the Tournament Organisers consent, allow them to shoot but their score not to count. In these cases a note should be made in the Record Status Booklet.
